- 7. Consideration of purchase contract award to Amick Equipment of Lexington, SC for the procurement of one (1) 2011 Tymco Model 600 Street Sweeper mounted on a 2011 International 4300 M7 cab and chassis in the amount of \$153,454.00.**

The FY2011/12 Budget provided appropriation for the procurement of a new street sweeper. The unit is scheduled to be lease purchased over a four (4) year financing term. The Tymco 600 sweeper is a very reliable and solid street sweeper. The City has owned this type of sweeper in the past and experienced good service out of it. The price of the unit is an excellent price and we are fortunate that piggyback bid is still available at this current cost given this original bid was a multiple unit price. In addition to purchasing the unit at base bid price (\$152,629.00) (take all deductions) I am recommending that the traffic directing light-arrow stick (\$825.00) be added for a total cost of \$153,454.00. It is expected that the unit will be delivered by mid October, 2011 and I will have a financing option for Council to consider at the October, 2011 meeting.

## City Manager's Comments

August 3, 2011

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**8. Consideration of offer to purchase approximately 6.5 acres of land owned by the City of Rockingham immediately adjacent to Sweet Haven Church located at 424 Midway Road in the amount of \$82,500.00**

At last month's meeting the City Council proposed to accept Sweet Haven Church's offer to purchase above referenced property. Proper notice and advertisement of offer to purchase was published in the RCDJ on July 15, 2011. No upset bids were received and thus in accordance with NCGS 160A-269 Council may now authorize the sell of referenced property to Sweet Haven Church in the amount of \$82,500.00. Upon approval by Council and completion of survey/legal documents a closing on this property may occur.

### **ITEMS OF INTEREST:**

1. The Rockingham Downtown WiFi network is now in place and available for use. There are a couple of spots where the signal strength needs improving and ETCOM and the City are working on that improvement which consists of simply adding one new module on Washington Street.
2. Work on Franklin Street Streetscape Project is moving well considering the heat and logistics. City crews have done an excellent job on this project and I have received numerous positive comments from businesses along the area where the improvements are occurring.
3. I am pleased to report that the City now is the owner of the McKenzie Building which will serve as the home of Discovery Place KIDS-Rockingham. The closing on the property occurred on July 18, 2011.
4. The process of hiring a new Community Theatre Director is proceeding well. Interviews with selected candidates will begin on August 5, 2011. It is hoped that we can have a new director on board within the next 30-45 days. I greatly appreciate the assistance that I have received from the Theatre Board during the selection process.
5. The Hitchcock Creek Debris Removal Project has been completed. Staff is currently working on trail map and securing/upgrading access points.

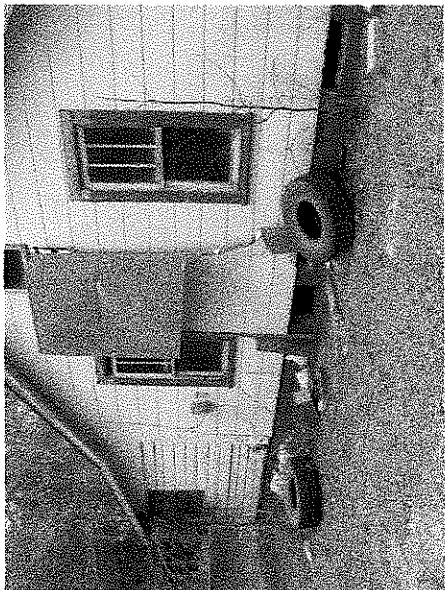
Re: Demolition Ordinance for Dilapidated Dwelling located at 867 Rockingham Road

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City staff recommends the City Council approve a demolition ordinance for the dilapidated dwelling located at 867 Rockingham Road and identified as Richmond County PIN 7473-17-21-1135. A copy of the demolition ordinance and photographs of the property are included in the agenda packet.

As background information, City staff initiated abandoned structure proceedings in March of 2011. The property owners and parties of interest were notified of a hearing with the Code Enforcement Officer regarding the condition of the dwelling via certified and regular mail, and notice was also posted on the subject property. No one attended the hearing. The Code Enforcement Officer issued his findings of fact and directed the property owners to either repair or demolish the dwelling by June 28, 2011. Notice of the findings of fact was provided via certified mail and regular mail, and notice was posted on the subject property. The property owner has taken no action to date.

**AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE BUILDING INSPECTOR TO REMOVE OR DEMOLISH THE  
PROPERTY HEREIN DESCRIBED AS UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION AND DIRECTING THAT A  
NOTICE BE PLACED THEREON THAT THE SAME MAY NOT BE OCCUPIED.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Rockingham finds that the dwelling described herein is unfit for human habitation under the City Housing Code, and that all the procedures of the Housing Code have been complied with; and

**WHEREAS**, this dwelling should be removed or demolished, as directed by the Building Inspector, and should be placarded by placing thereon a notice prohibiting use for human habitation; and

**WHEREAS**, the owner of this dwelling, William and Margaret Tyler have been given a reasonable opportunity to bring the dwelling up to the standards of the Housing Code in accordance with G.S. 160A-443 (5) pursuant to an order issued by the Building Inspector on March 30, 2011, and the owner has failed to comply with the order;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Rockingham, that:

- Section 1. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to place a placard containing the legend "*This building is unfit for human habitation; the use or occupation of this building for human habitation is prohibited and unlawful.*" on the building located at 867 Rockingham Road and identified by Richmond County PIN# 7473-17-21-1135.
- Section 2. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to proceed to remove or demolish the above described dwelling in accordance with his order to the owner thereof dated March 30, 2011, and in accordance with the Housing Code and G.S. 160A-443.
- Section 3. (a) The cost of removal or demolition shall constitute a lien against the real property upon which the cost was incurred. The lien shall be filed in the office of the City Tax Collector and City Clerk, and shall have the same priority and be collected in the same manner as the lien for special assessments in Article 10 of G.S. Chapter 160A
- (b) Upon completion of the required removal or demolition, the Building Inspector shall sell the materials of the dwelling and credit the proceeds against the cost of removal or demolition. The Building Inspector shall certify the remaining balance to the Tax Collector. If a surplus remains after sale of the materials and satisfaction of the cost of removal or demolition, the Building Inspector shall deposit the surplus in the Superior Court where it shall be secured and disbursed in the manner provided by G.S 160A-446.
- Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or cause to be removed the placard from any building to which it is affixed. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any building therein declared to be unfit for human habitation.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.
